If you are reading this book, then you probably want to find out how to obtain that most wonderful of opportunities – teaching bridge on a cruise ship. It's easy to obtain your first assignment. Being retained a second time is much harder. If you are successful with your first 'cruise bridge' position then you are more likely to be invited back. Follow the steps in this book and you will be on your way to scoring 'excellent' in the passenger survey sheets which guests are requested to complete before they disembark. The entertainment manager on my last ship told me that even though guests rate enrichment lecturers (including the bridge instructor) on a scale of 1 to 10, there are really only three grades:

- 1 Success (please come back)
- 2 OK (we'll take them back if we have to)
- Failure (never let them on my ship again)

Clearly, you should aim to be invited back, which means you need those high scoring grades to put you solidly in the Success box. I understand that it takes a score of at least nine out of ten to guarantee *Success*. At least one cruise line has been known to disembark the bridge instructors half way through a World Cruise for scoring less than eight.

Do not fret. With the information herein you can find an agent, get a booking, prepare well, deliver your promises, and keep every guest happy. This will ensure that you enjoy cruising and teaching for many years.
